The month of January is a busy one with the Lodges of Maryland as we install new Masters and officers in all Lodges. Congratulations to the new Worshipful Masters and their line of officers. Like most years I was able to attend a few of these, Not as many as normal as I had plans to head out of state with my Lady Kandi to visit a son in Kansas and deliver some of his property to a new home there in Wichita. We also had a planned vacation in February changed to January, so I was not present at very many of the Lodge installations. In the past I have had the honor and pleasure to present Master's pins to New (and repeat) Worshipful Masters on behalf of the Most Excellent High Priest. (this year Andy Martinez) A tradition that stems from the years of Grand Master Steven Ponzillo III during his term of office. These lapel pins are prized by Worshipful Masters across the State as they are a reminder to all, even after their time in office, that they were once in a position to run and organize a Masonic lodge of loyal Brothers and place their imprint upon their lodge. We in the York Rite must continue to support the Lodges of our area and attend as often as we are able, to assist in the Great work of the Lodge. Paramount among those efforts is the act of Creating Masons. The 3 degrees of which are carried out only in the lodges. It is from this source that we as York Rite Masons benefit to be able to welcome into our Chapters/Councils and Commanderies, the good men that become our new members.

The main event this month will be the celebration at the George Washington Masonic National Memorial in Alexandria Virginia that I have mentioned in past messages. This is the 100th anniversary of the Cornerstone laying at the Memorial, February 20 2023

There will be a rededication to the Memorial preceded by a parade down King Street in Alexandria. Thousands will be marching in the parade. Approximately 1200 Masons have registered to participate. Your Grand Commandery of Maryland has registered to participate and you Sir Knights can march along with us.

The long-advertised Celebration for the 100th anniversary of the Cornerstone laying at the George Washington Masonic National Memorial is upon us. The rededication ceremony of the laying of the cornerstone will be at 3:00 on the 20th of February. This will be preceded at 1:00 by a parade through Alexandria Virginia.

THIS EVENT IS ONLY WEEKS AWAY- ACT NOW TO SECURE YOUR SPOT The Grand Commandery of Maryland has registered to march in the parade, and all are welcome to attend to march along with us. As of now about 1200 Masons from around the country are signed up to participate with a total of about 2700 individuals in units along the route. The enclosed attachments have finally outlined the start point, path of the parade and schedule of events surrounding the Celebration. If you are able to attend, there will be a bus leaving Cockeysville and returning that day- We will post that information on the website under the EVENTS section - <u>yorkritemaryland.org</u> contact person is Scott Lapp If you cannot march, you are welcome to observe the parade from the King street observation area or attend only the Ceremony at the memorial itself. Families are welcome to observe the parade, however only Masons will be marching.

We are asked to dress in Class A Uniform with Chapeau/cap, buff gloves and swords. Alternatively if you wish to participate as a lodge member or Officer, please wear Dark suit or tux, aprons, collars and white gloves. WE ARE ALSO BEING ASKED FOR MEMBERS TO ACT AS PARADE MARSHALS- Several have volunteered but we are looking for a couple dozen more at this point to assist the formation and organization of the parade participants. If you are willing to act as a Marshall there is to be a meeting held by Parade director Tyler Vanice of the GWMNM staff at 10:30. - Please see the enclosed rules and procedures attached for the location. Parking is limited, there is a Metro stop near the assembly point that may be taken advantage of if you wish to park at a Metro stop and head directly to the start point.
