Sir Knights,

With attendance at a low point in the blue lodges, it is hard to recruit new members into York Rite. The good news is that every Commandery has a group of Sir Knights who have not given up. For instance, at Baldwyn Commandery in Gallop SK Robert Keene has some innovative ideas, like a community live music night, to draw the community to the lodge building and raise the profile of the Masonic bodies. I should also give kudos to Commander Clayton Kuehn at Las Cruces Commandery which is doing very well indeed with quite a few Sir Knights last year and I

hear they already have a list to attend the Land of Enchantment degree festival in 2023. Even with most of the Sir Knights in Las Cruces seeing the ritual for the reception of the Grand Commander for the first time, Las Cruces had one of the best openings and Grand Commander's receptions I saw while traveling the state. Each visit to each Commandery was special in its own way and I thank all of the Commanderies and Commanders for the warm hospitality. I also thank the Sir Knights who accompanied me on my travels.
