Our Annual Zoomposium was held on January 21st, 2023, with 54 Knights from all over the state and some from other Grand Commanderies. The agenda included the following topics:

Zone and Deputy Zone Commanders—Duties, Responsibilities, Obligations, Attendance, Quarterly Reports, Inspection duties, process/tactics, forms and reporting. Uniform standards, Dispensations, Constitutions, Regulations. Types of activities ZC's should be promoting/participating in for their Zone, Holiday Observances, parades, Honor Guards, Templar funerals, Commandery installations, etc., Chain of Command for handling problems in a Zone.

Recorders—Annual Returns, MMS system, forms, Recorders' access.

Grand Line Officers and all Sir Knights—Duties, Responsibilities, Obligations, Commitments (attendance) and Costs. Grand Line Officers website access and forms. Inspection duties, process/tactics, forms and reporting.

Zone Advisors—Duties , Membership Toolbox , Charities.

So, if you missed this event, it was recorded. Make plans and save the date for next year on January 20, 2024.

Continuing the opening theme for the year "Faith". "God's word says that we are saved by grace. "It's through Faith in Christ Jesus and not by our own efforts or works." Ephesian 2:8-9.

We are not saved by good works, but we are saved for good works. Those different prepositions make all the difference in the world. Good Works are evidence of salvation, not the cause of it. If there are no works or change of life to follow salvation, then it should be questioned whether the person/Sir Knight is truly saved.

What are the good works of our Grand Commandery and our Constituent Commanderies? There are many. Here's another example, but first let's recap the suggested good works starting from the beginning of the Grand Commandery year and General Order No.1:

October's Good Works for a Knight Templar and his Constituent Commandery is to gather information about his Commandery by researching old Commandery journals, minute books and submit a paragraph or two to SK Ron Brown REPGC, our Grand Commandery's Historian as soon as possible. The 3rd book of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar State of New York will be completed this year and available for sale at the 2023 Annual Conclave. We need your help. Two Volumes have already been written and published. The history of Grand Commandery of Knights Templar, State of New York 1814-2013 Volume 1 and Biographies of Grand Commanders, Grand Commandery of Knights Templar, State of New York 1814-2014 Volume 2.

November's Good Works for a Knight Templar and his Constituent Commandery is taken out of General Order 1—"Care-" As Knights Templar we are bound to give to poor and weary pilgrims, feed the hungry, clothe the naked and bind up the wounds of the afflicted." We need to take better care of our Sir Knights and their families by sending get well or sympathy cards and/or a personal phone call. That is the least we can do and we can and should do more.

December's Good Works—"Charity "Knight Templar Eye Foundation (KTEF). Our Mission to improve vision through research, education and supporting access to care. (Commandery Challenge for all Knights in a Commandery to be 100% Life Sponsors; \$30 donation to KTEF onetime fee). The bigger goal is to have all the Knights in the State of New York Life Sponsors to the KTEF.

January 2023—"Good Works"—Tactic & Sword Manual. This is a good time of the year to go back to basics. Opening/ Closing and the Sword Manual should be our normal work. The Tactic and Sword Manual prepares us to be better Knights. All Officers of each Commandery are expected to attend every Commandery Conclave. No Commandery can be expected to do ritual work if they cannot open in full form. A animated video is being developed for every Commandery so you have a visual aide in the opening. Remember, everything is in the Tactics Book—you just have to read it. Ritual (One of the greatest hallmarks that sets the Masonic Fraternity, especially Knights Templar, apart from all other fraternal or civic organizations is our Knights Templar Orders (Ritual)—especially when the Knights Templar Orders are conducted with precision and dedication. Remember, everything is in the plain English Ritual Book—you just have to read it.

"First Peter 2:9 says that you have been chosen by God Himself. People may overlook you. They may reject you.
