Grand Master Kenneth B. Fischer Initiated into White Shrine of Jerusalem

March 15, 2006, Sir Knight Kenneth B. Fischer, Grand Master of the Grand Encampment, and First Lady Arlene were initiated into the Order of the White Shrine of Jerusalem. The ceremonial, held in honor of Grand Master Fischer, was conducted by The Cross of Texas Shrine No. 1 in Houston, Texas. Six others were initiated in the same class. Sir Knight Fischer and Lady Arlene are center left in the picture.

Sir Knight John C. Elkinton, Aide d' Camp to Grand Master Fischer, writes: "The White Shrine of Jerusalem is a Masonic appendant body composed of Master Masons and their properly related female relatives. The Order of the White Shrine of Jerusalem is related to the Knights Templar by the most sacred and important ties. Both orders are founded on a belief in our Savior Jesus Christ and are dedicated to telling the story of His birth, life, death, resurrection, and ascension. This ceremonial was held in honor of our Grand Master in hopes that we could cement the bonds of cooperation and affection between our two orders."



Lawrence Eugene Tucker, GCT Installed Right Eminent Grand Recorder

Sir Knight Lawrence E. Tucker was appointed and installed Right Eminent Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the United States of America on Monday, April 24, 2006, by Most Eminent Grand Master Kenneth B. Fischer.

Sir Knight Tucker was hired as Office Administrator of the Grand Encampment on January 10, 2005, by Grand Master Kenneth B. Fischer, when it became apparent that Right Eminent Grand Recorder Charles R. Neumann would be unable to fulfill the duties of the office of Grand Recorder due to suffering a stroke in late 2004. Following the retirement of Sir Knight Neumann on December 31, 2005, Grand Master Fischer appointed Sir Knight Tucker R.E. Acting Grand Recorder.

The Grand Encampment office relocated to Houston, Texas, on February 1, 2006.

Eye Foundation Campaign Closes

The Knights Templar Eye Foundation reports a contribution total for the 38th Annual Voluntary Campaign of \$921,483.11, \$159,323.52 more than last year. Some Commanderies did an outstanding job as you can see for yourself from the following listings. Thanks to all those who worked so hard. A total of 1,158 Commanderies

participated in this year's campaign, 37 less than last year.

Texas took the lead in total dollars contributed, with Massachusetts/Rhode Island in second position and Pennsylvania third. A listing of top Grand Commanderies on a per capita basis found Massachusetts/Rhode Island first, followed by Colorado and District of Columbia, second and third respectively. The top subordinate Commandery on a per capita basis is Ivanhoe No. 2, Mexico, and the top subordinate Commandery for total dollars contributed is Honolulu No. 1, Hawaii.

Plaques and seals are being prepared for the 196 constituent Commanderies that reported contributions of \$10.00 or more per member. 165 Commanderies contributing \$5.00 to \$9.99 per member will receive certificates. These Commanderies


