<u>Ivanhoe Commandery #8 Starts New</u> Christmas Observance Tradition

Greensboro – A new tradition was added to this year's Christmas Observance by Ivanhoe Commandery #8 in Greensboro. Each year, the traditional toasts are recited for all to hear, and one of those toasts reads,

"To the Knights of today, the men and women of our Armed Forces, who stand guard around the world in defense of our Liberty and the American Way of Life. May our Savior be their Shield, and the Light of Truth be their sword."

To further commemorate the sacrifice of our fallen veterans in defense of our American Republic, an extra table was set up in the in the center of the dining hall, with an American flag, Holy Bible, and a single lit candle.

This candle was lit from the table upstairs in the lodge from the 11th candle in the traditional toasts, which is the position from which the above toast is traditionally read. This candle was then carried by SK Victor Gallimore from the lodge, at the head of the procession of Sir Knights and guests to the dining hall and placed on the empty table to commemorate and honor the sacrifice that each generation must be willing to give to preserve Liberty for all.
