New Instructor Certification Forms Available from the Grand Commandery

North Wilkesboro – SK Mark Alexander, Grand Instructor-Inspector and Junior Grand Warden for the Grand Commandery, has published updated electronic forms for candidates to become Certified Instructors. There are three separate forms, one for each of the Orders. They can be completed in any order, and you have one year to complete all three from the time you start your first certification.

Completed forms can be emailed directly to the Grand Instructor-Inspector. A certificate and jewel will be presented to each successful candidate who completes all three Orders. The jewel can be worn on the uniform and qualifies as a Meritorious jewel in order of precedence, per uniform regulations.
