GRAND COMMANDER'S MESSAGE

Well, here we are again, inspection season. Why do we do inspections? Why do we want the Order of the Temple performed at these inspections?

We are a military organization and from time immemorial, the military has held inspections to make sure the organization and the men were ready to complete their mission successfully. We stand for inspections to make sure that our Sir Knights and Commanderies are giving our new Sir Knights the best experience possible rather than just reading meeting minutes, hearing the treasurers report and going home. A Masonic organization that cannot open and close in due form is not a proper Masonic Order. Our ritual is what makes us different from all other civic organizations. We even teach our youth organizations about opening and closing in ritually correct form. This tradition has existed before the Grand Lodge of England was formed.

We are a Masonic organization. We perform Degrees and Orders to teach incoming members lessons in Masonry. Civic organizations read a statement of the objectives and requirements of the organization to new members. There are no lessons involved and no further lessons in life are given. In Masonry the lessons are ongoing. Each time a Degree or Order is performed more of the lessons become clearer. The Red Cross, Malta and Order of the Temple are those lessons that give and give and give. A number of years ago each and every Commandery could perform all three of these orders to impress upon candidates the beauty of and reason for being a Knights Templar and a Soldier of Christ Jesus.

Now we are doing the Orders in mass form. The inspection requiring the Order of the Temple to be performed is not done to just to demand that a Commandery comply to a process. It is done to help the Commandery do the best Order possible to give the candidate the best experience of his Masonic Life.

I was initiated into York Rite at Guthrie at a festival, but, SK James C. Taylor at Elk City Commandery did not allow me to participate with many others in the Order of the Temple. He, instead had me participate alone in the most impressive and significant performance of my

Masonic Life. I participated in an Order that was first communicated in the Colony of Massachusetts in 1769. It furthered my involvement as a Christian.

Please endeavor to give future candidates the opportunity that they too can feel the singular participation in this great and impressive Christian Order. They will be more inclined to attend and participate in your Commandery.

The Committee members and Inspectors did an excellent job of setting up the inspection dates. The Inspectors are there to help make your performances better, not to chide or criticize you.
