Greetings Sir Knights,

First, I am going to ask you for your input. According to Section 115(8) of the Templar Code of Oregon, I am inviting you to put in your invitation for the location of the next Grand Conclave of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Oregon. We have already had an invitation to return to the Mill Casino in North Bend. If you would like to make an invitation, contact your District Supervisor with information as to meeting facilities and lodging so it can be sent to the Time and Place Committee for consideration.



We are now entering the warm months of the year. I have sent out General Order 1 which authorizes the Summer Uniform from May 1st to September 30th. Should the weather remain hot as it has in other years I may extend it if asked.

June also brings elections and a change in leadership. I am asking you to have your Recorder send a copy of the new officers to the Grand Recorder as soon as they are installed. Many Commanderies will be going dark for July and August. I am suggesting that while you do not have a Stated Conclave that your Commander call a Special Conclave to practice ritual, practice sword work,

or to have a social gathering to share fellowship. Meetings outside the Asylum are critical for us to band together as as Sir Knights. It is much too easy in gathering for the meeting and dispersing after the meeting is over. But you never get to truly know those in your asylum until you have sat together over a meal without the confines of the meeting room, and laughed together and genuinely talked with one another.
