*To the Officers and Knights of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Tennessee, and to the Officers and Knights of the Constituent Commanderies thereof:*

Sir Knights,

In 2018, at the 67<sup>th</sup> Triennial Conclave, the Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the United States of America extended recognition to the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar United States of America, & Its Jurisdiction, P.H.A., Inc. This was done with the instruction that each Grand Commandery was to follow the lead of its respective Grand Lodge regarding policies of recognition and visitation among its members. In 2021 the Grand Lodge of Tennessee extended recognition to the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Affiliated Grand Lodge of Tennessee, and at its 2023 annual Communication voted to allow visitation.

As such, the Grand Commandery of Tennessee will now allow visitation by members of Commanderies under the jurisdiction of the Prince Hall Affiliated Grand Commandery of Tennessee into Commanderies under the jurisdiction of the Grand Commandery of Tennessee, effective the same date as the Grand Lodge of Tennessee.

The specific policies regarding visitation are the same as those of the Grand Lodge of Tennessee as set forth in the *Grand Lodge of Tennessee Prince Hall Visitation Policy* that was distributed on June 13, 2023, by MW Grand Master James R. Arnhart, Jr., as well as those set forth in the *Statutes of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar USA*. A copy of the Grand Lodge Visitation Policy is attached for reference. The relevant sections of the Grand Encampment Statutes are as follows:

**Section 222.** If he is not otherwise properly vouched for, a Visitor must be examined by a committee of one or more members and the committee must report that it is convinced that the Visitor is a member in good standing of a recognized Commandery or Priory of Knights Templar, before the Visitor may be admitted to the Asylum.

**Section 223.** If a member objects, no member of another Commandery can be admitted into an Asylum unless he visits in an official capacity. The objection may be made openly in the Commandery or privately to the Commander, and in neither case can the objector be required to disclose the reason for his objection.

This letter is to be read at the next stated conclave following its receipt, and such reading made a part of the minutes.

#### **Commandery Membership Award Program, The Guidon**

At the present time the Grand Commandery of Tennessee issues three membership awards at the Grand Conclave.

1. Largest Percentage Net Gain
2. Largest Net Gain
3. Most Knighted

It is the order of the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Robert Burnette Beam, to add a fourth, and to award a Guidon in lieu of a paper certificate in all categories. This award will be the:

4. Largest Average Percentage of Membership Attendance

One of the many traditions in military units and religious orders, is the use of a guidon. A Guidon is a standard or flag that is carried to signify their unit designation.

The guidon is a great source of pride for each unit. It is a symbol that represents unity and solidarity, uniting all that came before to those carrying it today. In battle, it symbolizes perseverance and instills courage to continue forward.

Attached to the guidon are campaign streamers, or ribbons to recognize unit achievements and events. Streamers communicate the name and date of notable participation in a particular battle, event, or campaign.

So, what does this mean to the modern Knights Templar?

The Grand Commandery will provide four guidon staffs adorned with a guidon, depicting a device representing Tennessee Templary.

Starting at the grand conclave in 2024, the Commandery that wins each category will receive a guidon and streamer. The Commandery will display the guidon in a prominent place in their respective conclaves, depicting their accomplishments and inspiring pride in belonging to the Commandery.

The Commandery will maintain custody of the guidon until the next annual Grand Conclave. The streamer will be removed and placed on the Commandery beauceant or displayed in the asylum in a manner fitting this award. The guidon will be carried to the grand conclave to be awarded to the qualifying Commandery each year.

The vision of this new award program is to inspire a sense of pride; promote cordial competition; and raise awareness, attendance, and participation at each Commandery, improving our work quality.

# From the Grand Generalissimo

This message is for the Commandery member who has not attended a function or meeting of your Commandery within the past year. First, let me remind you of our mission as a body of Templars in Tennessee:

*The mission of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Tennessee is to provide every Christian Freemason in Tennessee the opportunity and resources to develop, be engaged in, and exemplify a Christian chivalric lifestyle.*

Now, who is the Grand Commandery of Tennessee? Well, it is not just the four of us who have been elected to serve a four year term serving as your dias officers. Nor is it limited to the corps of other elected and appointed officers and committeemen of the Grand Commandery. What about the Commanders, Past Commanders, and local Commandery officers? Yes, them too, but also each and every man who carries a valid Commandery dues card for the Commandery in Tennessee. Yes, this means you.

So, the mission statement above is not just for me or for your local Commandery officers but also for you, personally. If it is our mission to provide these opportunities and resources, then I ask you, "What exactly have you, personally, done to help us fulfill this mission this year? Don't tell me you paid your dues. That is just the initial cost of being part of the group. If that's all you intend to do, you are getting a good deal on the purchase of the order's reputation for the price of your dues. Besides, the dues structure of most of our Commanderies is so low that it makes it almost impossible to achieve our mission.

Who do you think should be providing these opportunities and resources? It is us, the same folks who enjoy the opportunities and resources. This is a mutual aid society to provide each other the chivalric experience. Are you carrying your part of the load? If not, why not?

Maybe you have decided that you get nothing out of the order. Re-read the mission statement. It is about what we put into it, not what we get out of it. One of the four fundamental traits of a true Knight is *selflessness*. One of the reasons that some of our Commanderies are not providing the experiences set forth in our mission statement is that about 90% of our members are putting forth no more effort than writing an insignificantly small check each year.

Just think of the possibilities of what our Commanderies could accomplish if even half of that 90% spent one half of one percent of their time contributing to accomplishing our mission. Our mission is not limited to conferring orders, contributing to the Eye Foundation, or sending ministers to the Holy Land. Our mission is involved in providing a Knightly experience to men who possess and exhibit the four fundamental traits of Christian Chivalry.

Being a Knight is very special to me. It is not some title someone bestowed on me at the conclusion of a day or two of watching ceremonies conferred on someone else by someone else. Templary is much more to me than just another Masonic degree, much more. What is it to you? More importantly, what do you want it to be?

Our Commanderies are just on the threshold of participating in a great Templar revitalization in Tennessee. Not so much a resurgence of large numbers as a reinstatement of offering a true Knightly experience to those who are interested. Are you interested? We need your help. Do you want to be part of this chivalric experience? As the Marine Corps says, "We are looking for a few good men." I think we already have them, but they have been so focused on what the order is not giving them, that they failed to see their role in making it happen.

Are you one of these? If so, I invite you to join in this new crusade to make the Chivalric experience we offer one of the most profound experiences any man can enjoy.
