


Sir Knight Gilbert Curtis Celebrates 50 Years of York Rite Service

North Wilkesboro - On August 21, 2023 Wilkes York Rite Bodies presented Companion and Sir Knight Gilbert Curtis with his 50-year award for Service in the York Rite.

The presentation took place in the dining room of North Wilkesboro Lodge #407 and was attended by many of Gilbert's closest family and friends. The award was presented by the Eminent Commander of Wilkes Commandery #40 and District 8 Commander Pat Day, along with North Wilkesboro Chapter No.78 High Priest David Barlow, Wilkes York Rite Recorder Mark Alexander and the Most Illustrious Grand Master of Cryptic Masons in NC Bill Poteat.



Sir Knight Gilbert "Gib" Curtis, US Air Force, Retired

Gilbert "Gib" Curtis was born on July 10, 1931, in North Wilkesboro, NC. He first entered the US Army at Ft. Jackson, SC and served his first tour of duty in 1949 at Camp Drake, Tokyo, Japan, and with the First Calvary and 24th Infantry Division in Beppu, Japan. He joined the Air Force in January, 1953, completing basic training Lackland AFB, in Texas and munitions specialist training at Lowry AFB at Denver, Colorado.

His first assignment was at Hunter AFB, as a munitions specialist loading special weapons on B-29s/B-50s. He also worked on B-47s and was selected for a 5-member loading crew at Kirkland AFB, Albuquerque, NM to load experimental weapon on a B-36. As Crew Chief for the 30th ADS Munitions Loading Team, his team took first place honors in the Oct 10-16 worldwide munitions loading competition at Lincoln AFB, Nebraska in 1958 with a spot promotion to Technical Sergeant.

In 1959, at Barksdale AFB, LA, he helped form the 53rd MMS to be assigned at Seymour Johnson AFB in

North Carolina. While at Seymour Johnson (1959-1961) his team attended the 1960 Bomb Comp at Bergstrom AFB in Texas where they took first place on B-52's. In 1963, as Weapons Maintenance Supervisor for the 73rd MMS of the 4158th Strategic Wing at Elmendorf AFB, Anchorage, Alaska, his team won Best Munitions Maintenance Squadron in the 15th AF & SAC.

He was assigned in 1967 to U Tapao, Thailand to the 4258th Strat Wing, 4258th MMS as shift supervisor and later as branch chief, where he supervised the loading of conventional bombs on B-52's. After completing his tour in Southeast Asia, Sgt Curtis was assigned to 65th MMS in Blytheville, Arkansas as Maintenance Superintendent for a brief time before re-assignment to SAC Headquarters at Offutt for his final tour of duty with MSET. In 1971, SMSGT Curtis received a line number for promotion to CMSGT but chose to retire in July 1971. Among his many awards for service to his country are:

- ★ Bronze Star for service in U Tapao 1968
- ★ Meritorious Service, SAC MSET 1971
- ★ Air Force Commendation Medal with two bronze oak leaf clusters 1958, 1961, 1967
- ★ National Defense Service Medal with Gold Star

Gilbert was made a Royal Arch Mason on October 6, 1973, Greeted a Select Master and Knighted on October 13, 1973 (which is the 666th anniversary of the Papal Bull decree for the Templar heresy charge!)

Married for 46 years to Blanche Anderson Curtis, they have one daughter, Patricia Curtis Brooks. SGT Curtis works part-time for his daughter and son-in-law in their real estate business in Wilkes County, NC. His main interest since retirement has been re-building antique cars into street rods.
