In Boston Massachusetts, the news of the explosion was received at 9:04 am that morning. The news came in by telegraph, and by 10:00 pm, a relief train with Doctors, nurses, and medical supplies was dispatched that evening to Halifax. Also, the State of Maine sent 110 doctors, plus nurses and other volunteers as well. Trains from Philadelphia, and Washington were later dispatched. (Brian Douglas Tennyson's 2015 book, Canada's Great War, 1914-1918."

Our Brethren, Companions, Sir Knights and friends from Nova Scotia appreciate the support and compassion shown that December of 1917. This is why I was very pleased to see the tree, to remind me of Man's good works to his fellow Man.
