

To the Officers and Knights of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Tennessee, and to the Officers and Knights of the Constituent Commanderies thereof:

Sir Knights,

The people that walked in darkness have seen a great light: they that dwell in the land of the shadow of death, upon them hath the light shined. (Isaiah 9:2)

And leaving Nazareth, he came and dwelt in Capernaum, which is upon the sea coast, in the borders of Zabulon and Nephthalim: That it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Esaias the prophet, saying... The people which sat in darkness saw great light; and to them which sat in the region and shadow of death light is sprung up. (Matthew 4:13-14,17)

The birth of Jesus was the fulfillment of a prophecy that the light of hope and eternal life had come to overcome the darkness of death and despair. All around us, daily, we are reminded of this darkness. In the days of Isaiah, it was the darkness of war, oppression, poverty, and fear. In the days when Christ was born, it was Roman oppression and fear of the loss of national identity. Today, it is the darkness of "wars and rumors of wars," of poverty and injustice. # From the Grand Generalizzimo John L. Palmer, GCT Christian Chivalric Values Part 3

In the October issue, we began a series of articles on the "Christian Chivalric Values" as set forth by Sir Knight Richard Van Dorn, the first of which is, "A firm belief in the Lord Jesus Christ and his church." Last month we discussed the second of these values, "The courage to confront evil despite the odds of success." The third value is "A commitment to those less fortunate."

This is an area where our order exceeds expectations and provides a shining example for our society. As an organization, the Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the U.S.A. has three "official" charitable programs; the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, the Knights Templar Holy Land Pilgrimage, and the Knights Templar Educational Foundation.

The best known of these is probably the Knights Templar Eye Foundation. When I first became a Knight, this foundation almost exclusively paid for surgery to correct crossed eyes in children who could not afford the surgery. Local Sir Knights administered the program, helped the family with the paperwork, and coordinated with the surgeon. It was a very labor intensive process, but very rewarding for the Knights who participated directly.

Research funded by the Foundation eventually resulted in a treatment which almost entirely eliminated the need for these surgeries, and the focus shifted to providing funding for seniors who needed cataract surgery and could not afford it. After some time, it became evident that this assistance had evolved to helping recipients in only a few states. Also, federal and state healthcare laws significantly reduced the need. In 2010, the board of directors, observing the success they had previously had in funding the research which eliminated the need for surgery in children, decided to take a bold step and change the focus to funding research with the hope of eliminating eye diseases of all kinds. This new focus has been wildly successful. The foundation funds starter grants for young researchers who have not yet established themselves enough to be able to obtain grants from other sources. It also has established endowed professorship programs and research endowments at leading research universities and teaching hospitals. The Foundation also participates in direct patient care through the Seniors Eye Care Program in partnership with EyeCare America and the Foundation of the American Academy of Ophthalmology. Since its inception, the foundation has provided \$170,000,000 in assistance including \$36,000,000 in research funding and \$6,000,000 in endowments.

Our Knights become sponsors of the foundation by contributing \$30 to the endowments, but there are many levels of giving, up to the Grand Master's Sword of Merit which is awarded for a donation of \$25,000 or more. We are proud that

every single Sir Knight in our volunteer state is an eye sponsor. Our Tennessee chairman for the Eye Foundation is Sir Knight Tim Sutton who can be contacted at <a href="mailto:rtsutton3@gmail.com">rtsutton3@gmail.com</a> or (423) 384-5011.

My personal favorite Templar program is the Knights Templar Holy Land Pilgrimage. The purpose is to strengthen Christian ministry in our own neighborhoods by providing an intensive travel and study program for credentialed ministers who would not have the opportunity otherwise in the form of a study pilgrimage to the Holy Land. This Biblical study and historical and cultural immersion experience is provided to local Christian ministers in our area at the expense of the Sir Knights. It is administered and funded locally by our Knights, but the actual travel is taken care of by our national committee. There is a state-wide endowment for this purpose, and some of our commanderies fund their own pilgrim minister each year. The Knights Templar Educational Foundation provides financial assistance to students. These scholarships are open to all students regardless of their financial circumstances. In 1922, the Grand Encampment launched the Knights Templar Educational Foundation which was sustained and perpetuated by each Sir Knight paying annually the sum of \$1.00 for a period of nine years beginning July 1, 1924. Through the years the fund has grown, and Scholarships are available in several states, including Tennessee. The Knights Templar Educational Foundation has assisted more than 80,000 students for an aggregate monetary value of over \$38,000,000 through Loans and Scholarships to deserving youth. As you can see, as Tennessee Templars we have much to be proud of. Every Commandery and every Sir Knight in Tennessee should be actively involved in these charities. Are you?

And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sore afraid. And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you; Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger. And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying, Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men." (vs 1-14).

This is where we as Christians go for the story of Christmas, the true story of our Lord and Savior Jesus, which was prophesied throughout the Old Testament. In the book of Isaiah, Chapter 9:6: "For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counselor, the mighty God, the everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace."


